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Our Department

Establishment History

The School of Health was established under İnönü University upon the request of the Ministry of Health and the proposal of the Council of Higher Education, in accordance with the decision of the Supreme Health Council dated May 23, 1995 and numbered 18/1, and the enactment of the Council of Ministers' decision numbered 96/8616 in the Official Gazette dated November 2, 1996 and numbered 22805. Our school began education in the 1997/1998 academic year and was affiliated with the newly established Adıyaman University in accordance with Article 68 (b) of Annex 5467 dated March 1, 2006.

Subsequently, with the Presidential Decree numbered 2222 in the Official Gazette dated March 4, 2020 and numbered 31058, the School of Health was converted into the Faculty of Health Sciences.

Our Faculty of Health Sciences is an institution that trains nurses and midwives. Our Midwifery Department offers a four-year undergraduate education. Our department serves 331 students with 2 Associate Professors, 6 Assistant Professors and 3 Research Assistants.



They play a vital role in protecting the health of mothers and newborns, particularly during pregnancy, birth, and the postpartum period, and thus reducing maternal and newborn mortality.

Job Opportunities of Our Graduates

Midwifery graduates work as midwives in hospitals affiliated with the Ministry of Health, university hospitals, private hospitals, state hospitals, family and community health centers, and as academic staff in university midwifery departments.



Our Highest and Lowest Placement Scores by Central Placement

According to the 2024 ÖSYS placement results announced by the Center for Measurement, Selection and Placement, the highest score for students admitted to our department was 337.277, while the lowest was 305.237. All 100 available quotas for earthquake victims, freshmen, and students aged 35 and over have been filled. 366 students are currently enrolled in our department.
